Vabilo k prijavi prispevkov

Vabimo vas, da se udeležite 9. mednarodnega Simpozija mladih slavistov z naslovom Mejniki in prelomnice v slovanskih jezikih in literaturah, ki bo potekal 9. in 10. decembra 2021 na Filozofski fakulteti Univerze v Ljubljani. Simpozij organizirajo Študentska sekcija Zveze društev Slavistično društvo Slovenije, Oddelek za slavistiko in Oddelek za slovenistiko Filozofske fakultete Univerze v Ljubljani.

Mednarodno srečanje je namenjeno vsem mladim, ki v svojih raziskavah obravnavajo slavistične teme s področja jezika, literature, didaktike in prevodoslovja. K predstavitvi prispevkov vabimo študentke in študente ter mlade doktorice in doktorje znanosti na slovenskih in tujih univerzah oz. vse, ki so univerzitetni študij že zaključili in se z razpisanimi temami strokovno ali znanstveno ukvarjajo.

Uvod

O naslovu letošnjega simpozija smo začeli razmišljati ob dogodkih, povezanih s 140. obletnico smrti Josipa Jurčiča, avtorja prvega slovenskega romana *Deseti brat*, ki je pomembno posegel v razvoj slovenske proze. Ker pa se tokrat nismo želeli pokoriti »diktatu obletnic«, smo se odločili, da nas bo koncept prelomnic in mejnikov v razvoju jezika, literature in ved, ki ju obravnavajo, zanimal širše.

Obletnice rojstev, smrti in dogodkov, ki jih označujemo kot prelomne, so pogosto osrednji razlog za organizacije prireditev, izdaje zbornikov, monografij, tematskih števil revij ipd., saj jim je običajno v narodnih zgodovinah pripisan močan simbolni pomen. Tako kot v zgodovinopisju nam prelomnice in mejniki služijo kot ogrodje za obvladljivejše predstave o preteklosti, s čimer imajo poleg simbolne tudi praktično vlogo. Ob tem se pojavijo vprašanja, kot so, kakšne oz. katere dogodke prištevamo k »prelomnim«? Zakaj jih pojmujejo kot prelomne in na katere kriterije se pri tem opiramo? Kako so krojili razvoj področij, s katerimi se ukvarjamo? Kako se je njihovo dožemanje spreminjalo skozi čas? Ob teh vprašanjih vas vabimo, da se nam pridružite pri kritičnem razmisleku o prelomnicah in mejnikih, ki so zaznamovali slovanske jezike in literature ter vede, ki jih obravnavajo.

Tematski sklopi

- prelomnice v normiranju in kodificiranju slovanskih jezikov (slovnice, slovarji, pravopisi in drugi jezikovni priročniki)
- vprašanje kontinuuma jezikoslovnih tokov
- odmevna slavistična srečanja in njihov domet v stroki
- mejniki razvojnih etap slovanskih jezikov

- novi izzivi terenskega dela in pristopi k njemu
- sovisni razvoj metodologij v jezikoslovju in sorodnih vedah
- vplivi družbenozgodovinskih dogodkov na razvoj jezika in jezikoslovja

Literarna veda

- prelomnice v razvoju literarnih zvrsti, vrst in žanrov (prve pesniške zbirke, romani ...)
- mejniki za oblikovanje periodizacije literarnih smeri in obdobj
- vpliv recepcije tujih del na razvoj slovanskih literatur
- vpliv novih tehnoloških odkritij na literaturo in literarno vedo
- nove teoretske paradigme v literarnih vedah slovanskih narodov
- vpliv prelomnih zgodovinskih dogodkov na preučevanje/dojemanje/razumevanje slovanskih literatur
- tematizacija zgodovinskih, miselnih, tehnoloških idr. prelomnic v slovanskih literaturah

- pristopi k poučevanju jezika in literature
- zgodovina slavističnih kateder
- slovanski jeziki kot jeziki poučevanja

Prijave s **prijavnim obrazcem**, **povzetkom** in **kratko predstavitevjo avtorja** sprejemamo na elektronskem naslovu studentska.sekcija@zdsds.si **do vključno 1. maja 2021**. O izboru prispevkov vas po elektronski pošti obvestimo najkasneje **do 5. maja 2021**.

Povzetek (od **200** do **300 besed**) in kratka predstavitev avtorja naj bosta v jeziku prispevka (**vsi slovanski jeziki in angleščina**) in v angleščini; če je jezik

prispevka angleščina, mora biti drugi povzetek v poljubnem slovanskem jeziku.

Diskusija in komunikacija z udeleženci bosta potekali v slovenščini ali angleščini. Članke za objavo v zborniku bo treba oddati **do vključno 10. avgusta 2021**. **Če bo recenzent pogojno sprejel prispevek in ta kljub popravkom ne bo ustrezal zahtevam znanstvenega pisanja, si pridržujemo pravico, da prispevka v zborniku ne objavimo.** Predstavitev prispevka na simpoziju je omejena na 15 minut, sledi 5 minut za diskusijo.

Kotizacija za sodelovanje na znanstvenem srečanju za vse prijavljene znaša **15,00 EUR** in je v celoti namenjena pripravi zbornika. Stroške prevoza in prenočitve krijejo udeleženci in udeleženci sami. Milestones and Turning Points
in Slavic Languages and Literatures

Ljubljana, 9 and 10 December 2021

Call for applications

We kindly invite you to participate in the 9th international Symposium of Young Slavists entitled "Milestones and Turning Points in Slavic Languages and Literatures". The symposium will take place on 9 and 10 December 2021. The event is organized by the Student Section of the Association of Slavic Societies of Slovenia, the Department of Slovene, and the Department of Slavic languages at the Faculty of Arts, University of Ljubljana. The conference is intended for young researchers dealing with language, literature, education, and translation studies within the larger field of Slavic languages. The participants should be BA, MA, or PhD students at Slovene or foreign universities, or those who have already completed their studies and are engaged in professional or scientific work within the proposed subject field.

Introduction

The title of this year's symposium was motivated by the events surrounding the 140th anniversary of the death of Josip Jurčič, the author of *Deseti brat*, the first Slovene novel and a work that played a vital part in the development of Slovene prose. However, this time not wanting the symposium to be dictated by anniversaries, we have decided to widen its scope and take a general interest in various milestones and turning points in the development of language and literature.

Anniversaries of births, deaths, and other pivotal events are often an important motive for the organization of events, the publication of monographs, the issuing of thematic numbers of scientific journals, etc., because they hold a powerful symbolic meaning within the history of a nation. However, similarly to what the case is in historiography, milestones and turning points are not only symbolic: they also serve as the framework for the construction of plastic representations of the past, thus adopting a more practical function. Even so, some questions arise: What events are considered to be pivotal? Which specific events are seen as crucial for a given nation? Why are they considered as milestones and what are the criteria for an event to acquire this appellation? How did they influence the development of scientific fields within our purview? How did their understanding and treatment develop over time? We invite you to apply and join us in the critical consideration of these questions.

The list of possible topics includes but is not limited to:

Linguistics

- Turning points in the normalization and codification of Slavic languages (grammar books, dictionaries, and other reference books)
- The question of the continuum of linguistic schools
- Slavic conferences of import and their influence on the field
- Milestones in the development of Slavic languages
- New approaches to field work (and the challenges related with them)
- Interdependent development of methodologies in linguistics and its related fields
- The influence of socio-historic events on the development of language and linguistics

Literature

- Milestones in the development of literary genres (first volumes of poetry, novels, etc.)
- Milestones used in the periodization of literary periods and movements
- Influence of the reception of foreign works on the development of Slavic literatures
- Influence of new technologies on literature and literary studies
- New theoretical paradigms in Slavic literary studies
- Influence of ground-breaking historical events on the perception, study, and understanding of Slavic literatures
- Thematization of historical, perceptual, technological, and other turning points in Slavic literatures

Language didactics and didactics of literature

- Approaches to the teaching of language and literature
- History of Slavic chairs at universities
- Slavic languages as languages of education
- Didactic manuals through time

Application procedure and submission of summaries

The applications consisting of the application **form, a summary of the conference paper, and a short CV of the author** should be sent electronically to studentska.sekcija@zdsds.si by **no later than 1 May 2021**. The application form is found on the website of the Student Section of the Slavic Society of Slovenia. The applicants will be informed whether their topic has been chosen for presentation **by 5 May 2021**.

The summary (from **200 to 300 words**) and the short CV must be written in both the language of the conference paper (**any Slavic language or English**) and

in English. If the language of the paper is English, the second summary must be written in a Slavic language.

The organizers will communicate with the participants in Slovene and English.

The papers must be submitted by **no later than 10 August 2021**. **All papers will be anonymously reviewed and should be corrected thereafter by the participants. If the reviewer conditionally accepts the contribution but the corrections which are subsequently made fail to raise the paper to the proper standards of scientific writing, we reserve the right of not publishing it in the symposium's proceedings.** The time limit for presentations is 15 minutes, followed by 5 minutes for discussion, which will be in either Slovene or English.

The conference fee is **15€**. The collected funds will be used to cover the costs of preparing the symposium's proceedings. We are unable to reimburse any expenses related to travel and accommodation.
